

Jacqui and Neville Legg, the managers of this dairy farm, send some additions and changes on this article.

- The precise location is west of Rahim Yar Khan near Jamal Din Wali which is near to the eastern banks of the Indus River midway down Pakistan.
- The article pointed out Dr. Erwanto and Dr. Waseem as the veterinarians. That's not correct. The veterinary team comprises three young Pakistani trained men - Waseem (Veterinary Manager), Qadeer, and Afzal, who all received training from Mr Erwanto who has since returned to his homeland of Indonesia. Their main focus being animal nutrition - being proactive instead of reactive. Ensuring animal health is maintained through correct nutrition.
- As mentioned, the original herd was imported from Australia, comprised AFS - Australian Friesian/Sahiwal, Friesians and Jerseys.
- Fodder Manager, Habib Sultan and his team produce up to four crops of maize during the summer and autumn months - green fodder not cobs - and obtain between 15-26 tons per acre four times a year. All up between 60-80+ tons of maize per acre depending on the particular block. In the winter jevi (oats), annual alfalfa and berseem are grown and in the spring we grow alfalfa and millet. Modernisation of the tractors and agricultural equipment enables the team to complete harvesting of a block during the day and have the next crop in the paddock overnight.

This season 5000 tonnes of silage was also produced but this is only used to make up any short falls we may experience due to climatic conditions. e.g. floods. Operating alongside the dairy, Mr. Sohail and Mr. Mairaj manage the forage unit producing quality hay made from either alfalfa or Rhodes Grass which supplies the dairy and other markets both within Pakistan or exported into the Middle East and South East Asia.
